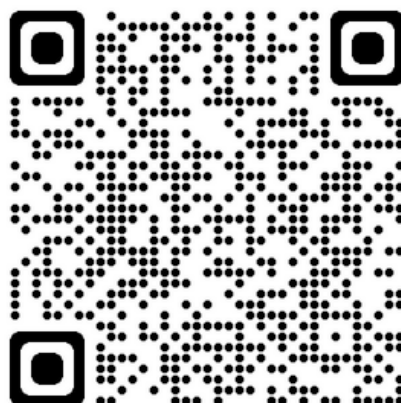

What You'll Learn

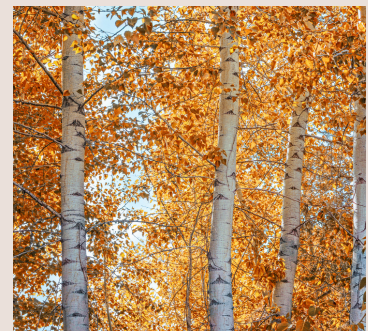

Tangible Takeaways from Workshops

Potential activities include but are not limited to:

- Developing outdoor learning skills through scavenger hunts and landscape inventories, encouraging children to observe and appreciate nature
- Gaining insights into Indigenous worldviews and perspectives to inform teaching practices, fostering cultural understanding and respect among children
- Creating nature-based art using collected items, promoting creativity and connections to the environment
- Sharing stories related to water, resistance and advocacy to foster a strong connection with the natural world
